


Who Was Gary Shupin?

Providing a Supportive Environment for Your Young Adult

Shupin Community provides a warm and supportive environment for young adults with developmental disabilities. We offer a broad range of services, activities, and opportunities that enable residents to enjoy full lives as members of our community.

The Shupin Community is managed by a team of JFCS professionals who work closely with residents to foster lifelong learning, success, and well-being. The JFCS staff also ensures that day-to-day programming is dynamic and well-structured and that it meets each resident's individual needs and interests.

Providing Independent Living Skills

At every stage of life, most of us want to grow, explore, and learn. That's how we feel at the Shupin Community, too. Our staff works closely with residents on acquiring skills—whether it's opening up a bank account, going to the grocery store, taking public transportation, laundering clothing, dressing for work, or planning and cooking meals.

The Community's services include vocational training and resources, financial management, personal care, and coaching in social skills.

Advancing Residents' Health and Well-Being

The Shupin Community is part of JFCS, a family service agency that has been helping members of our community for more than 160 years. We have a wealth of experience in meeting the needs of those who turn to us for support and assistance. At the Shupin Community, residents benefit from care management, health-care coordination, dietary planning, and more. Our staff works closely with you and other residents' families to offer individually tailored care plans that promote optimal health and well-being.







Forming Community with Others in San Francisco

Residents are part of a welcoming community that offers them many choices of programs and activities. Our Social Club—for both residents and non-residents—sponsors cooking and music classes, get-togethers at the Jewish holidays, recreational opportunities, and social and cultural outings. Club members also benefit from a buddy/mentor program that gives them a chance to form friendships with students in the San Francisco community.

Offering Safe, Secure, and Quality Living

The Shupin apartment building is located in one of San Francisco's most vibrant, beautiful neighborhoods: Laurel Village. Residents are steps away from shops, grocery stores, banks, transportation, and cultural and recreational institutions, including the Jewish Community Center.

Situated on a quiet, charming street, the Shupin Community offers private one-bedroom apartments or two-bedroom apartments that can be shared. Each light and airy unit includes a fully equipped kitchen and a bathroom with a bath and shower. Laundry is on-site.

The property also has a lovely private garden with a patio and is fully secured. The residential services coordinator lives on the premises.
