Suggested Bequest Language

There are different kinds of bequests, each requiring specific language to direct your assets in a way that successfully carries out your final wishes.

Unrestricted bequest language

These bequests are extremely valuable, since they allow JFCS to meet future needs flexibly and imaginatively.

Language for a restricted bequest

BEQUESTS MADE THROUGH WILLS OR LIVING TRUSTS ARE THE MOST POPULAR FORM OF LEGACY GIVING, COMPRISING 80-85% of all planned gifts. Surprisingly, it is individuals ages 40-50, followed by individuals ages 50-60, who report the highest frequency of bequest commitments to charity. Never put off until tomorrow what you can do today! Giving by bequest costs nothing now, yet may give you a great deal of satisfaction to know that your future gift will live on.
